## From the Senior Pastor

## Lord, I'm Coming Home

I've wandered far away from God, now I'm coming home; The paths of sin too long I've trod, Lord, I'm coming home. I've wasted many precious years, now I'm coming home; I now repent with bitter tears, Lord, I'm coming home. I'm tired of sin and straying, Lord, now I'm coming home; I'll trust Thy love, believe Thy word, Lord, I'm coming home. *My* soul is sick, *my* heart is sore, now *I*'m coming home; *My strength renew, my hope restore, Lord, I'm coming home. My only hope, my only plea, now I'm coming home;* That Jesus died, and died for me, Lord, I'm coming home. I need His cleansing blood I know, now I'm coming home; Oh, wash me whiter than the snow, Lord, I'm coming home. *Coming home, coming home, nevermore to roam; Open wide Thine arms of love, Lord, I'm coming home.* 

This isn't a song in our current United Methodist Hymnal, but I remember singing it in the church of my youth. There was a clear sense in songs such as "Lord, I'm Coming Home" that God was our home. To hope and trust in Him alone; to seek the cleansing blood of Jesus at the cross; to know the transforming power of His Spirit; to be embraced by his arms of love... these were the things that made life worth living. Though the song was written long before my birth, it spoke to my heart.

In Luke chapter 15, Jesus tells the story of a son who had wandered far from home. He confesses that he had sinned against Heaven and his father. He was willing to give up all the rights of a son if his father would simply let him come home. The beauty of the story is in the realization that the father was as anxious for his son to return home as was his son. Seeing him trudging down the road toward home, the father runs to embrace him. He orders a celebration to be held. He replaces his son's rags with the finest clothes available.

It may be that in this new year you find yourself far from God and far from home. You've been wandering for too long, lost in the wilderness of your sin. Jesus knows what you're going through. He knows your heart and he knows how to heal it. He is anxiously waiting for you—his child— to come home.

I pray that in this new year, you will trust in Him, turn away from your sins, and follow Jesus all the way to that home he has prepared for you in Grace and peace, Sol heaven.

#### Report to VUMC Council - January 16, 2018

The Center continues to operate smoothly with the help of our wonderful volunteers who graciously serve our guests. We are pleased to have served 24,553 persons in the café and at 797 events since our opening in 03/16.

The Verona Moose Lodge has donated a bike rack for outside the front entrance and a defibrillator. A CPR/AED class was conducted 1/13/18 and 9 volunteers attended and were certified.

Sufficient funds have been raised for the showers in ladies and men's rooms, shower stalls have been delivered, however, have not been installed due to there not being the necessary drain pipes in place from the buildout. Hopefully this issue will be resolved soon and the showers operational.

The donated washer and dryer have been operation for over three months and have been used 28 times.

# **Food Pantry News**

During 2017 our Verona Church Food Pantry mission team worked diligently to reach people in our community with gifts of food, support, and friendship, and for this we give thanks. Our fifty member team spread God's love to many and brought smiles to the faces of those in need. Without the support of our entire church family this would not have been possible. Your generous financial donations and always keeping our collection boxes overflowing with the items we requested to stock our shelves may each be seen as our focus on making a holy difference in our local community and reaching people just as they are. Our doors are open each Tuesday and two Thursdays a month. Last year we helped many as seen below:



<u>Age</u> Children 18 and under – 1129 Total People served – 4124

Adults 19-59 – 2266 Adults 60 and above – 711 Total Families Served – 1413

During the entire year our expenses were about \$15,000. This was only possible because God's love was alive and moving in our church family. Thank you to all who supported this mission with you faith, focus, and making a difference in the world in which we live. Without us all working together this would not have been possible.

## **REVIEW OF OUR STEWARDSHIP FOR 2017**

[Note: figures are rounded up or down]

2017 was a solid year financially for our church and we thank everyone who supported our ministries through your tithes, gifts and offerings. Highlights include:

- We finished the year with \$195,000 in all funds (not including \$140,000 in Day Care funds) This was an increase from \$174,000 at the beginning of 2017.
- Our income was \$430,295—\$2,600 more than our budget AND \$10,700 more than actual spending.
- Our Virginia United Methodist Fund investments netted \$20,085 in earnings (incl. in income figures).
- Our ONLINE General Fund giving was over \$36,000 for 2017, or approximately 8.5% of all giving.
- The total left to raise for the "Organ Fund" was reduced from \$48,490 to \$11,841.
- The \$72,000 line of credit debt (used for a new roof several years ago) was paid off.
- Our Adult Mission Fund increased from \$14,933 to \$22,075.
- Over \$6,125 was raised for the Pastor's Discretionary Fund. \$5,204 was disbursed in meeting emergency food, medical, and housing needs in the local community.
- The Food Pantry Fund increased from \$16,254 to \$27,024.
- The Aisle 7 Fund increased from (-\$19,599) to \$24,615




