From the Senior Pastor

omings and goings, hellos and goodbyes, beginnings and endings.... We have so many ways of describing life's inevitable parade of transitions. I always struggle with messages like this in the last days of December. We're celebrating Christ's birth, of course. But we're also closing up shop on the past year and preparing plans for the next. All the while we're struggling with colder, shorter days (it's the middle of the afternoon as I write—17 degrees and gusty winds).

Sometimes it seems that life is only about comings and goings. This past year we said good-bye to family and church members who left this life. We celebrated births. We made new friends and said good-bye to old ones who moved away.

I once read a letter written in 1844 by a man who was a long-ago neighbor of a farm we owned. The letter, written to a friend who had moved west to the mountains of Virginia, was a lengthy compilation of births, house-fires, and deaths. His last words to his friend were: "Well, such is the way of the world, some coming in and some going out."

If that was all life was about—the comings and goings—then life would be a fairly spare affair. But it really isn't the beginnings and ends that matter most. After all, we have no choice in our births or deaths. Our choices are in what lies between. It's who we become after our births and who we are when we die that matters most.

What will we do with the year before us? Will we put behind us the hurts and disappointments that sometimes hold us back from moving ahead with God's plan for our lives? Will we find time in the midst of hurried schedules to help a neighbor, speak with a child, or kneel in prayer?

The Scriptures tell us in Ecclesiastes 3 that there is a time for every purpose under heaven. What purpose does God have for us in 2017?

For three centuries Methodists have joined in the following covenant prayer at the beginning of a new year. May it be our constant prayer in 2017:

I am no longer my own, but yours. Put me to what you will, place me with whom you will. Put me to doing, put me to suffering. Let me be put to work for you or set aside for you, Praised for you or criticized for you. Let me be full, let me be empty. Let me have all things, let me have nothing. I freely and fully surrender all things to your glory and service. And now, O wonderful and holy God, Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer, You are mine, and I am yours. So be it.

And the covenant which I have made on earth,

Let it also be made in heaven. Amen.



10 Questions for Christians in a New Year



nce, when the people of God had become careless in their relationship with Him, the Lord rebuked them through the prophet Haggai. "Consider your ways!" (Haggai 1:5) he declared, urging them to reflect on some of the things happening to them, and to evaluate their slipshod spirituality in light of what God had told them.

Even those most faithful to God occasionally need to pause and think about the direction of their lives. It's so easy to bump along from one busy week to another without ever stopping to ponder where we're going and where we should be going.

- **8.** What's the most important way you will, by God's grace, try to make this year different from last year?
- **9.** What one thing could you do to improve your prayer life this year?
- **10.** What single thing that you plan to do this year will matter most in 10 years? In eternity?


