### Verona Community Center ~ Report to VUMC Council - October 17, 2017

The Center continues to buzz with activity with café users and increased event bookings for fall and winter. We are pleased to have served over 20,600 persons since our opening in March 2016. We are having events from tap dance class, dog training, baby showers, educational meetings and laser tag and everything in between!

A three-week basic computer class is being held and response was not as we hoped, so we will revamp the curriculum for next class. We had a yard sale on September 23 with net proceeds of \$410.

We are having a fun fund development activity on Friday, November 17 - a Senior Prom for adults, with Richard Adams and the Boogie Kings performing. Please plan to attend!

The Verona Moose Lodge is building a bike rack for outside the front entrance and may also donate a defibrillator. Church members and our volunteers are donating snacks and water for the café which is so much appreciated, along with other items like paper towels, hand soap, disinfectant wipes and cleaning supplies.

Sufficient funds have been raised for the showers in ladies and men's rooms, shower stalls have been delivered and this project will be completed within the next couple weeks.

Treasurer's Report to date 2017 for operations - Income \$72,098 and expenses of \$73,046, leaving a deficit of \$948, however with 2016 carry-over, we are still at approximately \$19,000 positive balance (exclusive of buildout).

## Greetings from Aisle 7!

t's November and the time of year I most often find myself reflecting on what I'm thankful for this year. I think often times we are drawn to only see the negative actions or events in our society, forgetting to recognize the beautiful things around us; especially in light of so many tragedies (natural and man made) over the last few months.

Many studies have shown that it takes 3 to 5 positive thoughts or experiences to cancel out 1 negative thought or experience — isn't that crazy? What a great challenge for us this month: cancel out the negative things in our life and focus on what can be lifted up as praise to our Lord and Savior. This can be recognizing something as small as the leaves changing color to as big as a promotion at work or the healthy birth of a loved one. Here at Aisle 7 we have a lot to be thankful for:

- This year we were asked to make Brunswick Stew for the Verona UMC Fall Festival (with 100% of the proceeds being split between the Verona UMC Food Pantry, the church's Adult Missions Fund, and the Verona Community Center). We had a lot of volunteers who donated, prepped, and made the stew. All the hard work was rewarded as the stew sold out in under 30 minutes! I think it is safe to say the Brunswick Stew, and the Fall Festival, was a huge success.
- Our Small Groups are growing: we are looking to start two new Life Group at this fall. And the Lord is already blessing this goal as a couple folks have volunteered to host the new groups at their house or lead discussions.
- We are getting more and more folks joining us for the Community Meals, which are scheduled for the last Sunday of each month. We see several non-church goers visit on Community Meal Sunday and it is an honor to serve them with a warm meal and friendly conversation.
- Our VUMC/A7F youth group went to the Fields of Faith event at Fort Defiance for the second year in a row. For those not familiar with Fields of Faith, it is a student-led Fellowship of Christian Athletes event where youth invite, pray for, share with, and challenge their peers to read the Bible and follow Jesus Christ. It was an inspiring evening for the youth and I'm excited to see how the experience will impact our youth.

Lastly, we were completely surprised and humbled by an amazing offer to support a Hurricane Relief Mission Trip in early 2018. The offer made was to match funds up to \$10,000 in an effort to have a team from Aisle 7 go to Puerto Rico and help fellow U.S. citizens recover from the destruction of a devastating hurricane season. This mission trip will be quite challenging as there is still many variables and unknown factors as we plan how to best help. Our goal is to work in conjunction with other teams and volunteers to help rebuild, support, and provide aid to folks that have lost everything. Please pray for us as we discern how to organize and prepare for this journey. And if you're interested in being a part of the trip, please speak to Pastor Kevin soon!

As always, thank you to all of the volunteers that make Aisle 7 church the warm, welcoming place that it is week after week! If you are interested in being a part of what we do every week, please let us know- we are always looking for more help! In the meantime, my door is always open if anything is weighing on your heart.




