 ${f I}$ t's the first Sunday morning in August and Lydia and I are at our son's home in Monument, Colorado, 7,500 feet above sea level.

Being in Colorado gives me several good excuses not to go for long walks with Lydia

The air's too thin. I will more than likely collapse before we reach the end of the driveway.

The land is too unpredictable. Who knows when we might walk off a cliff? The weather is too changeable. We could be a mile from the house and get caught in a summer blizzard.

I know I could come up with more excuses. "What if...?" is a favorite starting point for many of the excuses that come out of my mouth. And I'm pretty good at expanding on those "what ifs" and excusing myself from a lot of fairly safe activities:

What if we leave home for a week and the thermostat malfunctions and cools the house down to 60 degrees the whole time we're gone.... Imagine the electric bill!.... (This actually happened this summer)?

What if I show up at a church for the first time and nobody talks to me? What if I agree to serve on a committee and the meetings interfere with a Redskins game?

There is no end to a human being's ability to make excuses. But excuse-making carries a terrible price-tag.

It robs us of blessings and opportunities.

In Colorado I would have missed seeing the rabbits and deer and wildflowers on that walk. I would have been deprived of standing on a hillside and watching the sunset over Pike's Peak. And I would have been robbed of the bracing wake-up call of a Colorado wind announcing a cold-front's invasion on a hot summer day.

Living life under the tyranny of our excuses forces us to carry with us the regret of what might have been. What if I had spent more time with the people around me? What if I had spent more time with God? What if I had placed my faith and my life in the hands of The Most High?

What if I stop being robbed by my doubts and begin living the abundant life that comes through the grace of God in Jesus Christ alone! Grace and peace,

Well, it's officially the end of summer and what a summer it was! The eclipse has come and gone and kids have been back in school for weeks already. I for one am looking forward to coming season with cooler weather, fall sports (especially football), and the coming holidays.

The last month has certainly been quite eventful around here! The end of July and first week of August saw a team from Aisle 7 go on our much anticipated Service and Learning mission trip to Cherokee, NC to serve the Cherokee nation. We were able to complete some much needed home repairs and improvements and continue to build a relationship with the Cherokee people. I am eagerly anticipating next year's trip and being able to continue to pour God's love into the community there. Thank you to everyone who participated, whether volunteering on our trip or at any of our many fundraisers or simply being intentional about praying for our team and the work we were doing in Cherokee.

The other major event that has had a large impact on our church (and me personally) was the now infamous events in Charlottesville, VA. I was asked to take part in standing along with others from the Charlottesville Clergy Collective, at First United Methodist Church in downtown, offering aid or sanctuary to anyone in need. I witnessed firsthand some very intense displays of bigotry and hatred that have served to open up some difficult, but honest, conversations in our church.

The Sunday after the event, we decided to do church differently at Aisle 7. Instead of a traditional sermon, we placed our chairs in a circle and had an open discussion about the impact it had on each of us, on Charlottesville, on our country, and, most importantly, the impact it had on God's kingdom. We will be continuing this valuable and unifying discussion on Sunday, September 10th at 6pm in the Verona Community Center. We hope to be able to draw members of our community from all walks of life to take part in the discussion; whoever you are and whatever you believe, we want you there too.

We have just begun our new sermon series on Salvation, but I am already looking forward to the weeks after when we start our next sermon series: Back to the Basics: the Fundamentals. I plan on spending a few weeks going over the fundamentals of our faith, speaking about who God is, the person and holiness of Jesus, and what He did for us. We will also go over the traits, spiritual gifts, and the person of the Holy Spirit.

I am so excited to continue to grow in faith and understanding with all of you in the coming months. Thank you again to all of the volunteers that make Aisle 7 the warm, welcoming place that it is week after week! If you are interested in being a part of what we do every week, please let me know! In the meantime, my door is always open if anything is weighing on your heart.

Showering may not seem like a luxury but for someone who has fallen on hard times it might be something they simply are not able to do. There are a number of situations that someone who takes advantage of the ministry might be experiencing. They may have running water in their kitchen but due to plumbing problems have no water in the bathroom. They may have been evicted or have no home to take a shower in.

There are also mission teams traveling through the area who can take advantage of the showers as well as the future possibility of the community center serving as a disaster relief center in the event of flooding or another natural disaster.

The showers will be open during special hours during the week. Toiletries will be provided at the center for persons who come without soap, shampoo, etc. Volunteers will be specially trained to manage the ministry during the special hours the showers are open during the week.




