Dear Friends,

Dr. Graham Standish was the speaker at the Order of the Elder Retreat in Blackstone this past week (April 21-23, 2013). Dr. Standish is the author of "Becoming a Blest Church." Dr. Standish told us that 'spirituality" is the breath of the world. He said "spirituality" is often what we get at Retreat Centers and Conferences. He said the church is often "dead" because it has no "spirituality."

Far too many churches are consumed with "functionality." Functionality is when we are consumed with tasks, order and performances. We live in a mostly functional culture.

"Spirituality" is recognizing God's presence everywhere. "Spirituality" is emphasizing faith, prayer, kindness, and God's guidance. Spirituality emphasizes relationships over results.

When the functional serves the spiritual, it creates structure, but when the spiritual serves the functional, it becomes religious routine. The functional is measured in terms of quantity (numbers), but the spiritual is measured in terms of quality (relationships) and spiritual growth.

What is your church - functional or spiritual? Our United Methodist Church is pretty good at being functional but we have a ways to go before we are also spiritual. Take some time this week and pray for your church. Be concerned about the function of the church, but pray that spirituality will take "over" your church. Pray daily for your church. Pray for a structure that encourages discernment. Where your leaders go - that will be the way of the church. Pray for Spiritual Leaders in your church. Pray for your church to become one that encourages prayer and one that listens to God's voice.

We of the church today need to "pray" for the church that we will become the Spiritual Leaders God is calling us to be. *Tommy Herndon*

*Where have all the men gone and how do we get them back?* Following World War II the number of men in worship began to drop and continues to drop to this day. In 1950, for instance, 51% of worshippers were women and 49% were men. By 2010, 61% of worshippers were women and 39% men. Likewise, in 2010, 100 million men said they were Christians who did not attend church.

Best SPRC or PPR Meeting Ever!!! We have in the District Library a DVD called, "Role Renegotiation Model." It was shown at the Pastor's retreat this past fall. That is how I came across it. This is the best thing I have seen in years and I could not wait to put it to use in my churches. I strongly suggest one go over the entire presentation with either the lay leader or SPRC/PPR chair before the entire committee. Then follow the directions offered in the presentation and be prepared for the most informative and interesting evening. Since coming to the Conference in 1998, my past January meeting was the best meeting I have ever had. We were much clearer on our mutual expectations and had the opportunity to discuss and evaluate the expectations together.

Suggestion: make sure everyone is clear on what is meant. For example, "pastor should be more active in church events". What specifically does this mean? Should the pastor show up for every event? Should the pastor be present from the beginning to the end? What should the pastor be doing while at the event? Is the pastor expected to be there to set up/or clean up afterwards? The more specific and quantifiable the example the better.

Be prepared to hear some honest expectations that might rub one the wrong way. Ultimately this will help both the pastor and committee decide more clearly if a move is in order (and I dare say, "more honestly"). Another suggestion: watch the whole DVD - do not summarize or only view part of it. You cannot get the full impact of the session by shortening it in any way.
