

From Our DS

Dear Friends,

Annual Conference is now over and what a wonderful conference it was! The theme of Annual Conference was "Lord, Renew Us with Your Spirit".

There are so many highlights I know I will miss some but here goes:



Rev. Doug Martin retired after serving 37 years. He and his wife Ellen were on stage during the Retirement Service. Rev. Jim Radford will retire in November of this year.

Rev. Debra Copeland was ordained an Elder and Rev. Courtney Joyner was ordained a Deacon.

Pastors John M. Crawford, Melissa Fretwell, and Faith Evans were commissioned as Licensed Local Pastors.

More than 41,218 kits were collected for UMCOR for a total value of \$533,834. There were 30,844 Health Kits, 11, 306 School Kits, 5,325 Birthing Kits, 1,666 Layette Kits, 228 Cleaning Kits, 394 Bedding Kits, and 1,455 Miscellaneous kits.

We kicked off a Campaign to raise enough money to buy Mosquito Nets to protect 100,000 children. These nets cost \$10 each and more information will be forth coming.

The Virginia Annual Conference was awarded the award for raising the most money for The Advance for Christ and His Church and for leading the Southeastern Jurisdiction in giving to Missionary support. We also gave \$1.1 million to UMCOR for disasters around the world. Bishop Robert Hayes praised the Virginia Annual Conference for being one of the most outstanding annual conferences in all of Methodism, if not the most outstanding!

Rev. Beth Downs retired as the Director for Clergy Excellence after 16 years.

Bishop Cho proposed a time of conversation about sexuality issues. The proposal was part of a four-point look at new things coming from the conference in the next church year. The other points include the expansion of Discipleship Circles, the start of three new faith communities and the Imagine No Malaria Campaign. Bishop Cho announced that more than 200 churches had signed the Bishop's Prayer Covenant and more than 50 of these came from the Harrisonburg District.

Annual Conference ended with Bishop Cho telling us to "Get Out of Here"! Go forth and Make Disciples for the Transformation of the World.





2014 Annual Conference - June 20-22, 2014 - Hampton, Virginia

A brief synopsis taken from the **Daily News** from each Annual Conference Session follows below (for details go to www.vaumc.org, click on Quick Link 2014 Annual Conference, then click on Daily News):

Friday afternoon session: The 232nd Annual Conference opened with separate clergy and laity sessions on Friday, June 20, 1:00 p.m. Bishop Young Jin Cho called the 232nd session of the Virginia Annual Conference to order promptly at 3:00 p.m. As is custom, the gathering sang "And Are We Yet Alive." Bishop Cho gave his Episcopal address and gave thanks for his year a service. A prayer team has been meeting monthly to pray for the revitalization of the conference. He encouraged churches to become a Prayer Covent Congregation, a program begun last year. The second Bishop's Convocation on Prayer was held with 400 plus people in attendance. The Board of Discipleship has designed regional gatherings for training on prayer. As the 2016 General Conference



<u>Friday night session</u>: A Service of Remembrance and Holy Communion were part of the Friday night session at Annual Conference. The Reverend Rhonda Vandyke Colby gave the evening's sermon. The Reverend Barry Foster issued the invitation to Holy Communion. Bishop Young Jin Cho led the service.



<u>Saturday morning session</u>: Dr. Elmer Colyer, professor of Historical Theology and Wesley Studies at University of Dubuque Theological Seminary in Iowa, led a "teaching session" on "Renewal is not a Program: The Triune God of the Gospel is the Primary Author of Renewal." Conference Lay Leader Warren Harper delivered the Laity Address. Several reports were given from various boards, councils and commissions. Bishop Robert E. Hayes, Jr. from the Oklahoma Area led the morning worship.





<u>Saturday afternoon session</u>: The Annual Conference Retirement Service was the

first event to take place Saturday afternoon. The Rev. Jim Noland, pastor of Reveille UMC, Richmond, represented the 41 retiring class members and delivered a sermon entitled "Renewed by Remaining." Dr. Elmer Colyer returned for another teaching session and his subject was "The Triune God and Trinitarian Gospel: The Heart of Renewal." A video asking people how they would "Imagine No Malaria" was shown. When asked



for ideas on how to "Imagine No Malaria, Bishop Cho said, "I would dance!" and he broke into dance on the stage with the youth and members of the conference to Pharrell

Williams "Happy" song. The Cabinet spelled out Save 100,000+ Lives. Rev. David M. Burch, pastor of Vision of Hope UMC on the Harrisonburg District received the Denman Evangelism Clergy Award. Two other Evangelism Awards were given for Laity and Youth.

<u>Saturday evening session</u>: Saturday evening featured A Service for the Ordering of Ministry. This year, 27 persons were licensed as local pastors; 22 were commissioned as provisional members, one was ordained a deacon; 13 were ordained as elder; and one had orders recognized. From the Harrisonburg District: Rev. Debra Copeland was ordained an Elder; Rev. Courtney Joyner was ordained a Deacon; and Pastors John M. Crawford, Melissa Fretwell, and Faith Evans were commissioned as Licensed Local Pastors.



Sunday morning session: Bishop Cho concluded the 2014 Annual Conference with a sermon entitled, "Sing the Lord's Song in a Foreign Land." "For the past three days we have conferenced under 'Lord, Renew us with Your Spirit.' This prayer should be continued," the bishop said. "Please, do not stop praying. Now, we go back to our mission field and we will be asked to sing the Lord's song in a foreign land. If we truly listen and discern the will of God in prayer, we can faithfully and effectively sing the Lord's song in a foreign land."
