FROM PASTOR BOB—

Home is where the heart is. There's no place like home. I'll be home for Christmas.

ll of these phrases are familiar to you, I'm sure. While everyone may not have a warm spot in their heart for a family or church home, we all recognize a true home is a place of security; a place of love; a place where no matter how long vou've been away or how far you've traveled, the door is always open. Most importantly, it is a place where the Spirit of the Lord resides and presides!

Home is on my mind as I write during Homecoming Week at our church. Maybe you were there for one or all of the three nights of Homecoming Revival. Maybe you were at one of the Sunday morning worship services and the fellowship meal afterward.

Did you feel at home? I hope so. Because every church—whether meeting in a cave, a house, a humble chapel in the woods, or a towering cathedral, should feel like home. What happens in those places—places where the people of God gather to worship and listen together for God's leading—determines what kind of home it is. Some are a bit (or a lot) dysfunctional and others overflow with God's love.

But even when that place we call church is broken, it is still a home. It's a place of memories that can reinforce and reinvigorate our faith, take us back to times when we were given more grace than we deserved and times when we needed hugs from people who understood and empathized with our struggles.

The building we often call "church" has no meaning without those memories of people living out their faith with love and grace. The Bible tells us that we are the "living stones" God is using to build a holy people. Jesus himself didn't have a physical home in this world (Matthew 8) but he was the foundation upon which His Church would be built and he promised that when he returned to His heavenly Father he would prepare eternal homes for each of us. Perhaps the greatest contemporary example of what it means to be church can be found in the millions of homeless and persecuted Christians worldwide who find their home not in physical structures but in their faith in Christ and each other—a church built not with human hands but with the "living stones" of the redeemed.

Whether it is homecoming Sunday or going home for the holidays, it's the presence of God and the love of his people that make a place a home. May the bricks that surround us on Sunday mornings never be a barrier to God's love flowing into our hearts and out into the world. May our memories within those walls bring more than a nostalgic yearning for the good old days—may they also inspire us to go outside the walls of Verona UMC's sanctuary to share the Good News of Jesus and bring others into the household of faith. And may our greatest desire be to one day stand before the holy throne of heaven with our family of faith and hear our blessed Savior say, "Welcome home!"

Community Center Report

Since it's opening in 2015, the Community Center has served over 33,000 people

- The Verona Community Center Café had 632 guests in September 2018, an average of 24 guests each day the café was open. This exceeded the monthly goal by 182 guests. Forty-four events held at the community center during September totaled 917 guests.
- To date, the Community Center has exceeded the previous year's guest and event totals by 17%
- Showers were used 42 times in September, bringing the total number used since the showers opened in May to 132. Laundry facilities were used 58 times in September, bringing the total for the year to 193.

ORGANIZATION The community center is now incorporated and has filed for non-profit status with the federal government, a step which will allow for donations to the center to be tax-deductible without going through the church. It will also increase our eligibility for grants.

While others are enjoying celebrations with their friends and families, those who are hurting often feel even more lost, abandoned, and alone than ever.

Blue Christmas is a devotional book for the 28 days of Advent and Christmas Day. Each devotion includes a scripture selection, meditation, prayer, and suggested Advent action. Blue Christmas reminds us that all of our Christmases, even the darkest ones, can be filled with honesty and hope if we are first willing to sit in silence and bring our deepest fears to God.

The purpose of the United Methodist Women's reading program is to encourage women to expand understanding of God's mission, to increase sensitivity to all human beings and to encourage critical thinking about issues facing humanity. Our circles here recently purchased five books from the Reading Program list. They are:

- *I Love Growing Older but I'll Never Grow Old* a book about making peace with "whatever you are right now." It's about learning from the past and then moving past it.
- *Coaltown Jesus* a short novel about Jesus' visit to a 17 year old whose brother has died.
- Global Girlfriends How One Mom Made it Her Business to Help Women in Poverty Worldwide
- *Hope Runs* An American tourist, a Kenyan boy, a Journey of Redemption
- **Every Last Drop; Bringing Clean Water Home** a book for young people that shows how people around the world seek out and care for the precious liquid that gives us life.


