FROM PASTOR BOB—

Many years ago I purchased a book titled "The Jesus Style" by Gayle Erwin. Just like our savior Jesus, it was simple and straightforward. And it changed my life.

So I'm excited to have both of our campuses—Verona and Aisle 7—participating in a six-week sermon series on "The Jesus Way" beginning September 2.

Sometimes it seems that we try every way but "the Jesus way" in our personal lives and in our life together in the church.

To succeed we try the way of *consumerism*—appealing to our base desires to have more stuff, even if we're not sure what to do with it.

We try *celebrity*—attempting to gain status and popularity even when it means compromising the person God created us to be

We find ourselves drawn like flies to *charisma*—following others not because they are authentic and speakers of truth but because they just have that particular manner and appearance that appeals to us.

We try raw power—bullying and threatening and black mailing others in order to get our way.

Sometimes it seems like we try every way but the Jesus Way.

What is that Way? Why is it so different? Why should I follow it?

The Jesus Way can be summed up in three simple words that Jesus uses over and over in the Gospels: repent, believe, and follow. While our fallen instinct is to hide our sins, doubt God's Word, and go our own way, Jesus calls us to live in a constant state of humility before God and others—to believe God's Word—to follow His Son. If we find ourselves compromising those three things in order to reach some selfcontrived goal in life, we will eventually end up miserable, frustrated, and lost.

The Jesus Way is the opposite of the philosophy that "the ends justify the means." For Jesus it is the means that will determine our end. Do we recognize and repent of our sins? Do we believe, really believe that Jesus is the Way, the Truth, and the Life? And are we willing to take up our cross and follow Him? If we can focus on these three actions, then we can trust that Jesus will bring us not only home to heaven, but also to a place of joy and peace in this life, no matter what the circumstances we find ourselves in.

I hope you'll join us throughout September and into October for this life-altering series of sermons on living life the Jesus Way. And don't forget that in the midst of the series we'll celebrate Youth Sunday together on September 16th at both VUMC services as our youth lead us in worship and share their own testimonies of faith.





BITTERSWEET GOSPEL BAND

ABOUT THE BAND: The Bittersweet Gospel Band began as an extension of Bittersweet Ministries, at the time a rehabilitation home for men in East Los Angeles. The home, founded by Pastor Gilbert Romero, was a half-way house, a safe place, where men young and old could find stability, self-discipline and healing from their broken lives as gang members, drug users, alcoholics, and the abuse they suffered from the hands of others.

Pastor Gilbert came out of this same world when God called him to ministry. In the mid-1990's, the Band began to minister to the main stream of the Church of the Brethren, and to other denominational and non-denominational churches as well, with a focus on reaching out to youth and breaking down walls of cultural division.

With the Band's music and Gilbert's preaching, Bittersweet concerts take on a revival atmosphere. Pastor Gilbert is a dynamic speaker and presenter, as well as a smooth vocalist, percussionist, and songwriter. Joining him since 1997 is Pastor Scott Duffey, who plays guitar, sings, and also writes some of the music. Scott and Gilbert are from different worlds, but God has put them together as a model for intercultural ministry.

VUMC OUTREACH REPORT

This report is a "mid-year" report of the Outreach of Verona United Methodist Church. This is not a complete report, so please bring to my attention additions, corrections, expansions that can be included in a year-end report to our entire community. The real purpose of this report is to inform, document, recognize and encourage everyone to fully participate in living and fulfilling the Vision of Verona UMC. Outreach, as I see it, is everywhere and in everything we do!

The areas of ministry of outreach we are active in as a church include:

The Food Pantry: The food pantry team has been implementing system upgrades with computer tracking of clients as well as additional freezers and refrigerators, and other building updates for shelving, etc. to better serve our participants. Some statistics through July 2018:

Card Ministry: This is one area where we are providing a valuable ministry to our members, and I want to gather data as well as stories around how much this outreach ministry is appreciated.

Verona Community Center: Volunteers provide a number of services to our community through the community center begun by VUMC in 2016. While our church membership continues to make up the majority of community center volunteers, more and more volunteers are coming from other parts of our community. The free laundry service and showers are serving dozens in our community each month. Free laptop and internet usage continues to grow. We have distributed over 200 half gallons of milk to members of our community. Community groups have found the center a convenient place to hold meetings. A grant of \$2,500 is helping the center provide heating to a 1,000 sq. ft. area in the back of the facility so it can be used year-round.

Youth Mission Trips: Two trips were undertaken this year, one to Delaware and the other to Mexico. As we heard from the youth participants and the trip leaders during worship in July, these are life changing experiences and also ways that we witness and make a difference in the world. Last month's newsletter gave details on the number and names of participants and specific examples of how their presence made a difference in the lives of those they served.

Adult Mission Trip: The mission trip to Florida February 24 through March 3rd was another "positive, life impacting experience," something I can say with certainty as it was my first ever mission/ministry experience. It also strengthened the bond of our church members from both VUMC and A7F as we came together to minister and work for others who truly were in need and came to know other aspects of God's love for all of us.

VUMC OUTREACH REPORT (continued)

United Methodist Women: The UMW provides outreach in most, if not all, things they do. Some examples I know of and want to help share with our congregation includes the assembling of Health Kits, and other care kits which the UMW coordinated the donations for and assembly of these kits to contribute to UMCOR and other relief missions. The UMW also provide school supplies to families that need some assistance getting their children ready for back-to-school.

VUMC children activities: BLAST, Bible School, children's church, etc.

Apple Dumpling Gang: A dedicated and energetic group of folks make and sell apple dumplings multiple times per year. These delicious dumplings bring awareness to VUMC and provides funds that are used to further outreach by supporting Weekly Religious Education (WRE) in local schools, Young Life, VBS, and other needs of our congregation.

Petal Pushers: Another dedicated and energetic group takes care of our grounds and ensures that our facilities are always inviting to Verona visitors.

Thank You! Every member and regular participant in our activities is also an extremely important part of our outreach! When you engage in intentional or even casual conversations about your love for Jesus and our various fellowship and worship opportunities, you are actively providing outreach for Jesus and Verona UMC, Aisle 7, and the Church. 


