## From the Senior Pastor

In the first weeks of spring in the Shenandoah Valley you would think it would be hard to feel anything but joy and peace. We are in the midst of a spectacular display of God's finest work in nature. The warm sunshine has replaced the chill and gray of winter; the leafless trees are green and lush.

I'm especially fond of spring. Always have been. As winter retreats my flow of advances. I rise earlier to do my chores. I pull weeds, mow grass, throw scratch feed to our chickens, and check the first stores of honey and pollen by the bees.

But even with the extra dose of joy I feel this time of year, I can't retreat from the reality of a world that seems to have no shortage of inconceivable cruelty and systemic evil; including the widening gulf between rich and poor and the political divides throughout the world that poison hopes of human progress in the realms of peace, prosperity, and security.

There isn't a week that goes by that we don't hear of terrorist attacks, school shootings, or domestic violence that leaves us numb as we try to absorb the extent to which human beings daily inflict pain on their fellow human beings.

Still, the Bible, often written in times of war and exile and poverty, calls us to see the joy of life even when the lengthening shadows of winter and human depravity are upon us. Prophets remind us that true, sustainable peace and joy are found only in the God of creation. The God who shines light in the darkness. The God whose Spirit leads his people through disease and warfare in Africa; government persecution in China; terrorist attacks in Sri Lanka; and every other hurdle the enemy puts in our way.

Joy for the Christian is starkly different from the joy the average person longs for and despairingly seeks through human achievement, physical pleasure, and financial gain. Joy for the Christian can't be touched by the lack of any of these things.

Why? Because our joy is in the God who overturned the plans of Satan and the stinging power of death when his son died for our sins on the cross and was consigned to a grave that could not hold him.

Our joy is in every moment of every day and in every season of every year because there is no moment when God is not in control and our destinies are not assured through his son Jesus Christ. May we all carry within us the joyful assurance that Jesus is ours and that nothing in the past, in the present or in the future can separate us from God's love and saving, transforming grace!

Go in peace and shout for joy, remembering you are a baptized child of the Most High God, the Lord who reigns forever!





## Where The United Methodist Church Stands as of April 27, 2019

Message from the Interim Bishop of the Virginia Concerning the Actions of the February Special General Conference

#### Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Virginia Conference,

Greetings in the name and spirit of the Risen Christ who promises to journey with us always! Another step along the journey of our United Methodist Church was taken on Friday. The Church's Judicial Council (Supreme Court) reviewed, in the light of our Church Constitution, the church laws that were passed by our Special General Conference (global legislative body) in late February. The actions of that General Conference centered on our Church's positions related to the practice of homosexuality.

Many faithful United Methodists and churches have been significantly impacted by these decisions. Some have agreed, some have disagreed. Regardless of people's perspectives, many questions have been raised, hurt inflicted, unity tested, prayers raised and significant conversations started about our future. Let us always remember that this is about people's lives, for whom Christ died and rose again.

At the conclusion of this letter, I will share links to resources in which you can find detailed explanations of each decision that the Judicial Council made. Here, in simple language, I want to summarize the basics of our Church position and changes that were found to be constitutional. **Most of the changes will take effect starting January 1, 2020 except for the "gracious exit" provisions which are effective from now until December 31, 2023.** 

- 1. NOTHING CHANGED ABOUT the Church position that "all persons are individuals of sacred worth, created in the image of God," and that "we will seek to live together in Christian community, welcoming, forgiving, and loving one another, as Christ has loved and accepted us." "We commit ourselves to be in ministry for and with all persons." The Church also believes that "sexual relations are affirmed only with the covenant of monogamous, heterosexual marriage." and it does not allow same-sex marriages in our churches and by our pastors. The church does not ordain or appoint "self-avowed practicing homosexuals".
- 2. MAJOR CHANGES FOUND CONSTITUTIONAL
  - a. The definition of "self-avowed practicing homosexual" now includes people living in same-sex marriage, domestic partnership or civil union, or who publicly state it. These persons are not considered qualified for [UMC] ministry.
  - b. Boards or District Committees on Ministry must make a full examination and shall not approve anyone who does not meet the qualifications for ministry and the bishop shall rule unqualified persons, if recommended, "out of order." Bishops may not consecrate a "self-avowed practicing homosexual" as a bishop.
  - c. A pastor who has conducted a same-sex marriage shall be given a minimum penalty, after due, fair process, of one-year suspension without pay for a first offense and termination for a second. d. If allegations are brought against a pastor, any resolution of the offense must include agreement from the person bringing the allegation. The resolution must identify the harm caused and how that will be addressed by the pastor.
- 1. **7 PROPOSED CHANGES WERE FOUND UNCONSTITUTIONAL.** Some of these sought to provide a way in which to certify that only persons who would "uphold, enforce, and maintain" the Book of Discipline (our book of order) could serve in certain committees. Other proposals suggested an additional process for removing bishops from active office. The Judicial Council found these unconstitutional because of lack of balanced and fair processes.
- 2. **"GRACIOUS EXIT PROPOSAL"** was found to be constitutional for churches thinking of leaving the United Methodist denomination concerning homosexuality for a limited time from now until December 31, 2023. They would have a "limited right" to disaffiliate for reasons related to the Church's law concerning homosexuality for a limited time. Approval for such a move would require:
  - a. A two-thirds vote of the members of the local church
  - b. Terms related to financial and legal matters, apportionments and clergy pensions
  - c. Approval by a majority vote of the Annual Conference

When I was growing up, I had a Sunday School teacher who was fond of saying, "God has brought us this far...and God isn't finished with us yet!" While the decisions by the 2019 General Conference and the rulings of the Judicial Council are important, they are, by no means, the final word in the journey of The United Methodist Church.

Take some time to read the detailed material and reports that are linked to this letter. Talk to those of different perspectives in your local church and community. In less than two weeks, I will begin to visit all of our districts for further conversation and worship with you (see the link to your invitation). Then the Virginia Annual Conference will gather in Roanoke June 20-22. Visitors are welcome.

In just about one year, May, 2020, the General Conference will convene again to further pray, discern, further refine, and redefine who we are as United Methodists, as we have for over 250 years. This is not a time for "waiting" but for working with one another, building relationships with all of God's people and seeking God's will for our next steps on the journey. Please feel free to contact your District or our conference office with questions or concerns. As Wesley reminded us: "Best of all, God is with us!" *Grace and Peace, Peter D. #### Thank you so much for your generous contributions

to our first Remote Area Medical clinic offered in Harrisonburg Virginia! We were able to serve 601 individuals with 856 services totaling \$304,882 in free medical, dental and vision care over the weekend of March 2-3, 2019 at the Rockingham County Fairgrounds. Over 800 volunteers showed up to register patients; cook and serve volunteer meals; provide interpretation and translation services; treat hypertension and high blood sugar, provide mammograms, pap smears and

unteer meals; provide interpretation and translation services; treat hypertension and high blood sugar, provide mammograms, pap smears and immunizations; screen for HIV and Hepatitis C; conduct full dental exams including hygiene, fillings and extractions; and provide full vision exams including patients leaving with their brand new glasses made on site. A

wealth of community resources were on site as well as lots of support from our sponsors and donors.

Unfortunately, these services are greatly in need in our area and some patients were turned away once we met capacity as our ability to provide care was maxed out. 100% of donated goods and funds were used to provide patient care. Again, thank you for your support of this effort. We could not have done this without the wealth of generosity from our community.

#### **Donation Processors Needed**

#### **DUTIES INCLUDE**

- Counting and posting to accounts all cash and checks collected during the offering at regular services and special events/services or that come into the church during the week. Posting is done in our "Church Windows" accounting software.
- Accurately completing an Excel spreadsheet with all donations to the proper fund/account.
   This spreadsheet is provided to the treasurer.
- The spreadsheet totals and the items posted in Church Windows are checked and should always match.
- Ensuring that everything is posted correctly so that the Church financial reports and yearly giving statements are accurate.
- Keeping accurate backup documentation copies of checks, giving envelopes and other documentation as needed each week.
- Filling out the deposit slip and taking the deposit to the bank (night deposit box).

**TRAINING IS PROVIDED** on Sunday Mornings downstairs in the Treasurer's office starting at 10 AM. Donation processing normally takes a team of two people about 2 hours to complete. Processing on another day (Monday or Tuesday) is fine after the processors have been fully trained and are confident of the procedures. # 5 Interesting Facts About the Gospel of Mark

#### (Focus of Our Summer Sermon Series)

Each gospel account, including Mark's, plays an important role in the New Testament account of the life of Jesus. Its significance is revealed in the way it:

- Establishes Jesus as the prophesied Messiah
- Proves him to be the sinless Son of God that he claims to be
- Records his authority over nature, demons, and disease

## Here are some interesting facts about this important book:

#### 1. Authorship is attributed to John Mark

Next to the apostle John, there's more biblical information about Mark than any other gospel writer. Luke mentions him several times in the book of Acts. Mark eventually became an important part of Paul's life, and is one of the last people mentioned in Paul's final letters (2 Timothy 4:11).

#### 2. It's the shortest gospel

When you compare the original-language word count, Mark is significantly shorter than the other gospels. From longest to shortest, the gospels stack up like this:

Luke 19,482 / Matt 18,346 / John 15,634 / Mark 11,304

But don't let Mark's brevity fool you! It's packed with a lot of detail. When compared to Luke, Mark offers considerably more detail. Mark's account of Jesus' words is more specific. For instance, when Jesus raises a young girl, Mark is the only one who shares Jesus' command in Arabic, *Talitha cumi*. Luke only gives a Greek translation.

#### 3. It's action packed

In relation to the other gospels, Mark doesn't focus on dialogue nearly as much as he focuses on Christ's actions. This is seen in the way Mark uses the Greek word "euthus" typically translated as "immediately." Its use gives Mark's gospel an explosive sense of motion and immediacy. Throughout his gospel, Mark focused on Christ's power over demons, illness, nature, and even death—emphasizing Jesus is a true champion.

#### 4. It's focused on Gentile readers

Unlike Matthew, Mark seems intensely focused on communicating the gospel to readers who aren't overly familiar with Judaism.


