From the Senior Pastor

read a lot of columns by a lot of pastors. Some are concise and to the point. Most are a bit long-winded (sorry, but it's the truth). Pastors are preachers and being long-winded is a professional hazard.

So I'll get right to the point (and then drone on for awhile because I just can't help it). *Following Jesus can't be done with words alone (see James 1:22-25).* The devil can convince us that if we "babble the Gospel" long enough we're bound to wear someone down. That people will give their lives to Jesus just to stop us from preaching at them.

But for every word we preach there must be a bus-load of actions adding power to our words. People need to see us living out the Gospel. Living like Jesus. Walking in his steps, not just talking about something we really aren't willing to live out.

So (and here's where I'll put a stop to the words), I want to thank everyone in our church who shares Jesus by walking in his steps. Every youth and adult on the summer mission trip. Everyone of our youth working up at Camp Overlook this summer. Every volunteer in the food pantry or the community center or in the kitchen cooking for a grieving family. Every teacher, every lay preacher, every one who crosses boundaries to be Jesus to their neighbor.

You are God's will come alive and the Kingdom of God is in our midst because of you!

The last few weeks have been a tough time for many in our church and community. Family members and close friends have said good-bye to this world and there seems to only be emptiness where they once stood. But for a church established on faith in Jesus Christ, there is a message to share that can fill that emptiness.

At every funeral—whether in our sanctuary, at a funeral home, or by a graveside— I share this message: "We are a flesh and blood people who struggle with flesh and blood sins who need a God who loves us enough to die for us in the flesh. A God who is powerful enough to shatter and destroy the chains of sin and death so that we can meet him face to face and live with him forever by his grace alone" (see Romans 6:3-9).

That is the message the church has been established to share with the world. The good news that Christ has come and died and risen and is coming again—a message of hope. May it be a message that flows easily out of our hearts!

It's summertime "and the living is easy." Right? Not exactly. For our family summertime is mowing grass, weeding gardens, and keeping an eye on the bee hives. It's family visits and vacations. It's mission trips and camping trips. It's taking the dog to the vet and attending the Annual Conference for the Virginia United Methodist Church. It's baseball games and July 4th parades. And for Lydia and me it's celebrating our 44th wedding anniversary this year (that's so hard to wrap my mind around).

Summertime, and the living isn't really easy. In fact, it can be downright exhausting. But in the end, I don't think any of us would want to live a year without it.



5 Practices of a Peaceful Home

Learn to Laugh Proverbs 15:13 says, "A glad heart makes a cheerful face, but by sorrow of heart the spirit is crushed." Laughter is like medicine, and laughing together as a family is highly therapeutic. And it doesn't take a lot of effort to find things to laugh about. My daughter and I listen to the "PG Comedy" channel on Pandora in the car. We all take group selfies making silly faces, which is compounded even more with the Photobooth app. Learn to laugh, even on tough days.

Cultivate Contentment It's quite difficult these days to "keep up with the Jones'." Families are crashing and burning today in the rubble of financial disaster because of consumer debt. We must have, and then we must have more. But Paul wrote in 1 Timothy 6:6-8, "A godly life brings huge profits to people who are content with what they have. We didn't bring anything into the world, and we can't take anything out of it. As long as we have food and clothes, we should be satisfied." (GW)

Alleviate Anger Proverbs 15:18 says, "Hot tempers start fights; a calm, cool spirit keeps the peace." (MSG) Not all anger is bad. Anger is just a normal human emotion. It's all about what we decide to do with our anger that matters. When we stuff our feelings inside and leak or explode later, nobody wins. The better solution is developing the practice of giving soft answers to one another. One of the best verses for families to learn together is found in Proverbs 15:1, "A kind answer soothes anary feelings, but harsh words stir them up." (CEV).

Walk in Wisdom To walk in wisdom, you need to walk together. Realize that your family is a team and everybody has a position to play. It's not the parents against the kids, it's the family becoming all that God intended together, as a team. **Parents**, God has given you authority within the home, not so that you can take the place of God in your children's lives, but so that you can be His representative. God has given you wisdom to guide them. And He will give you more! Proverbs 15:24 says, "Wise people walk the road that leads upward to life, not the road that leads downward to death." (TEV)

Express Gratitude Philippians 4:6-7 says, "...do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." (ESV) There is incredible power in praying about tension and expressing thanks. There is a direct link between gratitude and joy, and often when we struggle to find joy, thankfulness is the answer.

To make your home an island in the midst of turbulent waters, try being intentional about discovering truth together, laughing together, encouraging each other. God knows we need peaceful homes more than ever! (from SermonCentral.com)

There will be plenty of food, water games for the kids, and s'mores of course! We will provide the meat, please bring a side dish to share plus your lawn chair!



Open for internet café guests and various events from birthday parties to dog training classes, we have served the Verona community with services they would not have otherwise enjoyed.

Our laundry and shower amenities have been a welcome benefit for some homeless individuals and transients. Free coffee or bottled water and a snack are very popular and appreciated while guests use the laptops or access wifi.

The success of the center has been largely due to our dedicated volunteers who have put in over 9,300 hours serving our guests. Thanks to those wonderful folks, the majority of whom are from VUMC. Blessings to each of you.

We are now a stand alone 501c3 non-profit organization and depend on our wonderful donors to exist. We are embarking on a campaign to renovate the back Shenandoah Room for more rental space to generate income for operating expenses. *Donations are totally tax-deductible and may be made to Verona Community Center, P O Box 780, Verona, VA 24482.*

We are governed by a volunteer board of directors consisting of ten persons in the community. A recent fundraising concert arranged by Valley Harmony Chorus had four wonderful musical groups enjoyed by a hundred attendees.

Our most pressing needs are for donations to help with operating expenses, as well as a few more volunteers who can fill in occasionally for summer vacations and some weekend hours. Shifts are normally three hours and handbook and brief training are available. DUTIES INCLUDE

- Counting and posting to accounts all cash and checks collected during the offering at regular services and special events/services or that come into the church during the week. Posting is done in our "Church Windows" accounting software.
- Accurately completing an Excel spreadsheet with all donations to the proper fund/account.
 This spreadsheet is provided to the treasurer.
- The spreadsheet totals and the items posted in Church Windows are checked and should always match.
- Ensuring that everything is posted correctly so that the Church financial reports and yearly giving statements are accurate.
- Keeping accurate backup documentation copies of checks, giving envelopes and other documentation as needed each week.
- Filling out the deposit slip and taking the deposit to the bank (night deposit box).

TRAINING IS PROVIDED on Sunday Mornings downstairs in the Treasurer's office starting at 10 AM. Donation processing normally takes a team of two people about 2 hours to complete. Processing on another day (Monday or Tuesday) is fine after the processors have been fully trained and are confident of the procedures. summer. We extracted 125 pounds of honey! Our second extraction will be on Saturday, August 3rd from 10 a.m. until 1 p.m.

One pound jars of honey produced by bees on our church property and at Project Grows in Verona are now available through the church office for just \$8 per pound. All proceeds go to our church's mission projects. Remember—local honey contains pollen that can help with your allergies. Our honey is organic, i.e., hives are maintained without chemicals and the honey is strained but not heated.






